Also, when all the other lights are turned off, this under-cabinet lighting can be used at various levels to change the look of the room. Adding dimmers to all the

other lighting in the room lets you choose a number of new looks.

Now, let's talk about bathroom lighting. Dimmer switches are often the least-thought-of aspect incorporated into a bathroom. With all the different light features added to baths these days—wall, recessed, accent, or chandelier—each separate light fixture should be on a dimmer. That way, the bathroom can take on its own personality. Studies say that we should not be exposed to bright light a few hours before we go to bed at night. Adding dimmers enables you to enter the bath in the middle of the night without being blinded by a bright non-dimmable light and then to get back to sleep more easily.

Lastly, let's talk about little things in your laundry room. Laundry rooms used to be hidden in the basement as if they were the eyesore of the house. With all the new technology and cleanliness in styling, you can now make it a clean room with some neat features. It's not Grandma's barrel wringer washboard unit any more. With the right setup and design, the laundry room becomes an area that is open, functional, and decorated just like the rest of the home. Now it's not so unattractive.
