Nina was rescued from a freezing trailer thanks to a call from someone one who heard her cries for help.

Three dogs and a rabbit were abandoned last winter in an unheated horse trailer left in a parking lot. They had no food, water, or bedding. Imagine the bone-aching chill from lying on a metal floor with temperatures outside in the mid-20s.

Thankfully, someone heard barking and called for help. Bucks County SPCA's Humane Law Enforcement officers worked fast to secure a warrant and rescue the animals from the freezing cold trailer.

Nina (pictured) and her companions were soon safe and warm at our Lahaska shelter, curled up in their beds with full bellies.

Nina was especially nervous when she arrived, but it didn't take long before she was greeting us with wiggly enthusiasm and showing us her playful personality.

All of the animals were returned to good health, neutered, and placed in new homes. We filed charges against the previous owner and they were found guilty on all counts.
