It's an impressive, coordinated effort that makes it possible to save nearly all the kittens brought to us from every corner of the county.

More foster volunteers are needed. Especially for the smallest "bottle babies."



As the weather warms, cats begin having litters – sometimes up to three litters a year. Last year, more than 700 kittens came to our two shelters, with more than 500 of those needing to spend time in a foster home. Most are orphans, but some come with their mother or are born shortly after arrival.

We couldn't save so many kittens without the help of trained foster volunteers. They give the extra time and attention our most vulnerable animals need to survive and thrive. Unweaned kittens require around-the-clock feeding which is not possible in the shelter. Our fosters also help with adult cats, dogs, and small animals throughout the year.

All of them are precious and needy!

Fostering is a wonderful way to save lives from the comfort of your own home!

Along every step of their 8-9 week journey, it is most often women coming to their aid. From the many kind people who bring kittens to the shelter gently tucked in towels and boxes and laundry baskets. To the 100+ foster parents who give them tender loving care at home. To our all-female veterinary and animal care teams who work hard to meet their every need to prepare each kitten for adoption.

- Some animals need fostering for a few weeks and others need more time. It all depends on what they need to prepare for adoption.
